The methodology employed involves the selection of all new full-time, year one undergraduate students on the official Fall 1997 enrolment file, who have a valid (and unique) student ID number, and were seeking either a bachelor's or first professional degree. The subset was then matched against the records for students who received a degree (in any program) from the same institution during the most current seven-year period (1998 to 2004).
