What would you like to do in Canada?	Study
How long are you planning to stay in Canada?	Temporarily – more than 6 months
Select the code that matches the one on your passport.	Select the code that matches the one on your passport
What is your current country/territory of residence? If you are presently in Canada, you should select Canada.	Canada <b>If you are applying from outside of Canada please email an immigration advisor for guidance.</b>
Do you have a family member who is a Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident and is 18 years or older?	Family member is defined as a spouse or common-law partner, dependent children and their dependent children.
What is your current immigration status in Canada? Choose Study Permit (in Canada)	Student
Do you also want to apply for a work permit?	No (You can apply for a co-op work permit at the same time if you are required to do co-op by your faculty and department).
Are you a full-time student at a participating post-secondary institution and want to work off-campus up to 20 hours per week?	No
When does your status in Canada expire?	Click on the ? to get details of what is required.
Have you had a medical exam performed by a CIC/IRCC authorized panel physician (doctor) within the last 12 months?	<i>Yes</i> or <i>No</i> depending on the time of the medical exam performed. If yes, upload an <b>eMedical Information Sheet</b> or call the IRCC call center at 1.888.242.2100 to obtain your <b>UMI#</b> . Afterwards, create a word document with the following info: date and country where you completed a medical exam and enter your UMI#. Your online application will prompt you to submit a confirmation of medical examination.
Have you lived in a designated country or territory for more than six months in the last year?	If you have lived in a country for more than 6 months in the last year <b>and</b> your country is listed as the country where an immigration medical exam is required on the IRCC website ( <a href="http://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/application/medical-police/medical-exams/requirements-temporary-residents/country-requirements.html">www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/application/medical-police/medical-exams/requirements-temporary-residents/country-requirements.html</a> ) then you <b>must</b> answer <i>Yes</i> . Otherwise answer <i>No</i> .
