Which of the following best describes your situation?	I have a study permit.
Have you had a medical exam performed by an IRCC authorized panel physician (doctor) within the last 12 months?	<i>Yes</i> or <i>No</i> depending on the time of the medical exam performed. If yes, upload an eMedical Information Sheet or call the IRCC call center at 1.888.242.2100 to obtain your UMI# . Afterwards, create a word document with the following info: date and country where you completed a medical exam and enter your UMI#. Your online application will prompt you to submit a confirmation of medical examination.
Have you lived in a designated country or territory for more than six months in the last year?	If you have lived in a country for more than 6 months in the last year and your country is listed as the country where an immigration medical exam is required on the IRCC website (www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/application/medical-police/medical-exams/requirements-temporary-residents/country-requirements.html) then you must answer <i>Yes</i> . Otherwise answer <i>No</i> .

<p>Are you able to make a digital copy of your documents with a scanner or camera?</p>	<p>Yes</p>
