





Experiential Learning

Choose meaningful learning opportunities beyond the classroom.



At Laurentian, we recognize that experience is essential to the success of our graduates entering the workforce. Experiential learning opportunities for our students are available in the form of enhanced leadership development, entrepreneurship and applied learning in varied settings to enhance their skill sets.

The Foundry – The Foundry is an innovation, entrepreneurship and leadership development program located within the spacious Jim Fielding Innovation and Commercialization Space at Laurentian. The Centre aims to support Laurentian students, staff, faculty, and alumni as they strive to develop innovative, creative, and professional skill sets and launch entrepreneurial ventures on campus. In addition to open collaborative spaces and dedicated meeting rooms, users also have access to a Makerspace facility with 3D printers, SOLIDWORKS® as well as other design software, a CNC Mill and laser cutter for training and product development purposes. Co-op Experience – This extensive work-integrated learning experience offers students a chance to gain a full year of paid employment to complement their academic studies. Programs offering co-ops include: Architecture, Computer Science, Engineering (Chemical, Mining and Mechanical streams), Sciences (Specializations in Chemistry, Biochemistry, Pharmaceutical Chemistry and Biochimie).

Internships – Internships pair students with employers to complete placements that vary in length depending on the program. The format provides students with a chance to work in a professional environment and gain valuable experience while often leading to full-time employment opportunities following graduation.

Customize **Your Degree**

Loving what you do is how you will live your life to the fullest.

Building and customizing your degree to include unique and/or complementary subject combinations can give you an advantage in the workforce.

We make it easy for you to pair subjects you are passionate about while setting you off on a path to a rewarding and fulfilling career. Embarking on a journey that combines your aptitudes and interests is the best way to ensure you are passionate about your future career. Each program has a certain number of required specialized courses that must be taken in order to successfully complete the program of study. Electives are courses that allow you to explore other areas of interest that can expand your career options. You can group electives into one field of study to enhance and/or complement their degree, thus creating minors, concentrations, and majors.

Please refer to each program for specific program requirements. Note: Laurentian typically offers 3-credit (semester long) and 6-credit (fall and winter semesters) courses.

You should consider your options and how your study path can allow you to create a niche for yourself in the workforce or take you exactly where you want to go. This path starts at the undergraduate level and can lead directly to the workforce, to graduate studies, or to professional schools.

Financial Assistance

Financial assistance can come in the form of scholarships, bursaries, loans as well as on-campus jobs. Our team is here to assist you in navigating these opportunities.





Applying for bursaries and financial aid really does pay off!

With Laurentian awards, campus jobs, and government funding options available, we can help you set a comfortable and manageable budget as you pursue your educational goals. The following is a sampling of the scholarships and bursaries available at Laurentian:

Academic Pathways Scholarships

(\$1,000) – Awarded to qualifying students who have transferred directly from a Canadian university or who are graduating from an Ontario college. Students with an Ontario College twoor three-year Diploma, with a minimum GPA of 80%, who were registered full-time from September to April at the previous post-secondary institution and who are registering in a full-time first degree undergraduate program are eligible. Enquire when submitting your application.

Band Funding – Students who are sponsored by an agency (e.g. El, Band, or other) are eligible for financial support. To expedite processing, all required documentation should be provided at the time of registration.

Jim Fielding Memorial Bursary

(\$15,000/year) – Awarded to students who may have struggled academically because of financial and personal challenges that limit their ability to concentrate on their studies. This award is renewable for three subsequent years. To be eligible, applicants must be registered as full-time students and

must demonstrate a financial need. In addition, they must be nominated by a teacher, guidance counsellor, or professional speaking on their potential and background.

Youth in Care - Former or current youth in the care of the Children's Aid Society who are pursuing their first postsecondary degree are eligible for a bursary of 2,000 dollars. This bursary is available to current and former youth in the care of the children's aid society (minimum of one year in care), who are pursuing their first post-secondary degree, studying full-time or part-time (prorated).

In order to qualify for the bursary, students must self-identify through the OSAP application process. Priority will be given to first degree, first-time applicants.

Whether you are a mature student applicant with no previous postsecondary education, a college applicant looking to apply your college diploma credits towards earning a degree, a transfer applicant from another university, and everything in between, you'll find your perfect fit among our host of program offerings and generous transfer agreements.

Mature Students

As a mature student, you may be working toward a degree after being away from formal education for several years or looking to expand your knowledge in a certain subject matter. We're here to help.

The admission status of "mature student" recognizes those adults without the previous academic prerequisites required for admission yet have interests and work experience that suggests anticipated success in university studies.

A mature student is someone who:

- is 19 years of age or older by the end of the academic year to which they have applied;
- has not attended a secondary or postsecondary institution for at least one calendar year before the beginning of their university studies;
- is not eligible for admission on any other basis.

Transfer Students

College and university students considering a transfer to Laurentian can expect a simple and straightforward application process and access to generous transfer agreements.

Consult the general transfer credit allocations and the specific college program pathways that may apply in your case. Once we receive your official transcripts, we will review your prior academic records to determine how we can expedite your postsecondary journey. Transfer applicants should note that conditional transfer credits may be granted, but are not guaranteed, using unofficial transcripts while we await final, official transcripts.

1-Year College Certificate Applicants

Did you know you can apply directly to university after completing a 1-year college certificate? A college certificate not only prepares you for a college diploma program, it also allows you to be admissible directly to a university degree program.* Contact a Laurentian representative today to learn more.

*1-Year College Diploma applicants are not eligible for transfer credits.

2- or 3-Year College Diploma Applicants

Students who have completed a college diploma may be eligible for transfer credits to programs offered at Laurentian.

Transfer credits may be awarded based on prior studies and can be determined once you apply for admission and submit official transcripts. Laurentian offers equitable credit value for previous studies, with special considerations based on grades and program affinity. To help you make the most of your previous educational experience, these pathway options include a full roster of program articulations between Ontario colleges and Laurentian University.

If a pathway agreement has been established between your former college and Laurentian University, the transfer credits are already determined based on your cumulative program GPA. For up-to-date pathway agreements between Laurentian and Ontario colleges, visit *laurentian.ca/admissions/undergraduate/ college-transfer-applicants*.

CÉGEP Applicants

Students with one year of studies at a « *Collège d'enseignement général et professionnel (CÉGEP)* » are eligible for admission to a degree program at Laurentian. Students must have completed a minimum of 12 academic semestered courses to apply.

DEC Applicants

Applicants who have completed their « *Diplôme d'études* collégiales (*DEC*) » are not only admissible to programs at Laurentian, they are also eligible for up to 30 credits of advanced standing. That is the equivalent of one year of study! Contact us to learn more.

University Applicants

Laurentian University recognizes prior learning from many postsecondary institutions. Students who have completed university credits may be eligible for admission with advanced standing (transfer credits) on a course-by-course basis to programs offered at Laurentian. Transfer credits may be awarded based on prior studies and minimum grades in required courses. Course descriptions may be required.

- A pre-university (4U) Grade 12 academic French or equivalent
- Three years of full-time study in a high school or post-secondary institution where French is the language of instruction (documentation must be provided by the student).
- A minimum grade of C-1 (advanced) on the Test de connaissance du francais (TCF), version for prospective students.
- A minimum score of C-1 at the written component of the Test d'évaluation du français (TEF).
- Diplôme approfondi de langue française (DALF) with a minimum score of C-1.

Canadian High School Graduates – Within Ontario

To study at Laurentian University, Ontario secondary school applicants must ensure they will have completed at least six Grade 12 level U/M courses by the end of June and will gualify to obtain an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

Advanced Placement (AP) – Applicants who have completed Advanced Placement courses in appropriate subjects with a grade of four (4) or more may receive transfer credits equivalent to a maximum of two full-year courses (12 credits). Applicants must also meet the regular university admission requirements since AP courses are not accepted in lieu of these.

International Baccalaureate (IB) – The International Baccalaureate is recognized at Laurentian University. Applicants must have achieved a minimum score of 24 and have fulfilled the diploma requirements with six subjects: three at higher level and three at subsidiary level. Transfer credits may be granted for higher-level courses with grades of five (5) or better to a maximum of 18 credits. Applicants who have successfully completed the IB diploma, with a score of 28 or higher, may be eligible for an additional 6 credits for a standard-level course with a grade of 5 or higher; for a maximum total of 24 credits. Applicants must submit their IB transcripts to the Office of Admissions for evaluation.

Glossary of Terms

Undergraduate Studies – Studies at the postsecondary level, typically for the achievement of a bachelor's degree.

Graduate Studies - Studies at the postundergraduate level, typically for the achievement of a master's or doctoral degree.

Bachelor's Degree – An undergraduate program that covers a major area of study and that typically takes four years to complete.

Master's Degree – A graduate level program that follows the undergraduate degree and focuses on a particular area within a field of study. Typically, this oneto two-year program consists of a thesis or capstone project.

Doctoral Degree – The most advanced degree that symbolizes the mastery of a specific area of study or field of profession, it involves a major research project or dissertation. It typically takes several years to complete.

Full-time status – Enrollment in 18-30 credits per academic year.

Part-time status – Enrolled in a minimum of 3 credits to a maximum of 15 credits per academic year.

3-credit courses – Courses that run for a single semester (i.e. September to December or January to April).

6-credit courses – Courses that run for a full academic year (ie: September to April).

BA – Bachelor of Arts

BAS – Bachelor of Architectural Studies

BBA – Bachelor of Business Administration

H.B.Com. SPAD – Honours Bachelor of Commerce in Sports Administration

B.Cosc. – Bachelor of Computer Science

B.Ed. – Bachelor of Education

B.Eng. – Bachelor of Engineering

BPHE – Bachelor of Physical and Health Education

B.Sc. – Bachelor of Science

BScN – Bachelor of Science in Nursing **HBSW** – Honours Bachelor of Social Work

3-Year Degree – Requires a minimum of 90 credits.

4-Year Degree – Requires a minimum of 120 credits.

Primary/Junior Division Teachers -

gualified to teach Junior Kindergarten to Grade 6.

Junior/Intermediate Division Teachers - gualified to teach Grades 4 to 6 and Grades 7 to 10 and are certified in a single subject taught in these grades.

Certificate – Requires 30 credits within a distinct field of study.

Concentration – A way of enhancing your degree by selecting a group of courses that are thematically related and requires a minimum of 36 credits within a distinct field of study.

Major – Indicates a specialization by completing a minimum of 42 credits concentrated on one specific field of study.

Minor – Indicates a small area of concentration by completing a minimum of 24 credits in a specific field of study.

Specialization – Indicates a higher degree of specialization in a subject area by completing a minimum of 60 credits concentrated on one specific field of study.
