The Student Awards Office is responsible for the administration of all forms of financial assistance for undergraduate students. The office administers the University's scholarship and bursary programs under the direction of the Senate Committee on Academic Regulations and Awards, the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP), other federal/provincial student assistance programs, and an emergency loan fund. Payment of awards is subject to the availability of funds. Where possible clients with mobility issues will not be required to line-up and will be dealt with on a priority basis.

Guidelines for Scholarships Administration

Laurentian University undergraduate program recognizes and rewards academic excellence of students who are registered in a full time course load, and who pay tuition fees to Laurentian University. If an applicant fails to renew, he or she remains ineligible for the award for the duration of their studies at Laurentian.

Not all scholarships are necessarily awarded each year. ***Payment of awards is subject to the availability of funds.*** To ensure that scholarships are equitably distributed, Laurentian University reserves the right to restrict the value of scholarships that any one student may receive. Awards will be applied directly to students' fee accounts. In the event that the scholarship has a total value exceeding the amount of fees, or that fees have already been paid in full, a refund will be issued to the student. Eligibility will be confirmed in October/November, and awards paid out by the end of November annually.

Major Scholarships

Students who receive major scholarships are not entitled to receive an Academic Excellence Award. For full details on eligibility or renewal criteria, please refer to Laurentian University website.

All Faculties

Academic Pathways Scholarships (\$1,000)

Criteria: Awarded to qualifying students who have transferred directly from a Canadian university or who are graduating from an Ontario College with an Ontario College two or three year Diploma, with a minimum GPA of 80%, who were registered full-time from September to April at the previous post-secondary institution (equivalent to 30 credits at Laurentian), and who are registering in a full time first degree undergraduate program. Application required.

Anne Crichton-George Scholarships

Established in 1998, in memory of Anne Crichton-George and her active involvement in Chapleau Ontario. Value: \$2,500/ea. Recipients: full-time 1st-year students from Chapleau, Ont. enrolled in any program (if there is no qualified applicant from Chapleau, the award may be given to a student from Northeastern Ontario). They must have achieved a min. average of 80% in an Ontario Secondary School (in six U/M courses), have demonstrated a broad range of interests and community involvement, as well as financial need. Renewable in subsequent years **with** acceptable academic standing. Students may receive this award in addition to other University financial aid. Application required.

Desiderata Entrance Bursaries

These bursaries are established thanks to the generosity of a cherished anonymous Donor of Laurentian University and named after the poem which served as inspiration during her life, "Desiderata" by Max Ehrmann. The Desiderata Entrance Bursaries are eligible for up to three full-time Laurentian University undergraduate students of any age who are current or former youth in extended society care (Crown Wards). The bursaries will directly support any tuition costs or education fees as well as recipients' living expenses for students primarily entering first year of any program. In selecting the recipients of the bursaries, priority is to be given to first year students entering

Laurentian University who fulfill the eligibility criteria. Award is renewable. Value is \$10,000 per year renewable for 4 years.

Francophone Excellence Awards - \$1250 (No application required)

This award has been created to encourage first year students to register in a program offered in French. To be eligible, students must: present a minimum of 80% on 6 best 4 U/M courses or equivalent, including required courses for his or her program. Students must register in 24 credits, (i.e. 80% of a full course load) taught in French. To renew the award, students must maintain 80% in subsequent years, and register in a minimum of 24 credits taught in French. Renewable for 3 years.

Frank S. Ressel Memorial Scholarship

Established in 1990 by the late Frank S. Ressel of Sudbury. Value: \$1,000/ea. Recipients: 1st-year students enrolled in any undergraduate program on the basis of academic standing in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).

Irvine G. Reilly Scholarship

The award, established by his family, recognizes the significant contribution of Dr. Irvine Reilly to the Laurentian University Faculty of Engineering over his 35-year career. Dr. Reilly joined Laurentian's Engineering Faculty in 1965 and continued to teach and undertake research at Laurentian until his retirement in 2000. An excellent teacher, he was also instrumental in the expansion and accreditation of the University's engineering programs. This scholarship recognizes a Laurentian University Engineering student who is entering the first year of their program. Preference will be given to applicants who have demonstrated financial need and those who are the first generation of their family to attend post-secondary. Award is renewable for up to four years as long as the student recipient maintains a "B" average.

Value is \$5,000 per year.

Jim Fielding Memorial Bursary

Value: \$60,000 - maximum of \$15,000 per year and renewable for three years (equivalent to the cost of tuition, cost of residence (if applicable), Super Saver Meal Plan and cost of books and equipment). Established by his children, Norinne, Murray and Craig. Mr. Jim Fielding was born, raised and lived his life in the Sudbury area. He was proud to be a member of a large well known area family and he relished every opportunity to be in attendance at numerous family occasions. Jim held the position of Chairman of the Board of Alexander Centre Industries Ltd. (ACIL), Waters and associate companies. Further, he was elected as Director of Canadian Pacific on May 7, 1986 and continued serving in that capacity through to his successful re-election in April 2000. He also had a passion for learning. He was highly respected in the business community, known as a caring and considerate employer who was always interested in others. This bursary was created to provide students with an opportunity to attend university and realize their fullest potential. It will be awarded to students who may have struggled

academically because of financial and personal challenges that have limited their ability to concentrate on their studies. Preference will be given to students pursuing applied studies. Recipients cannot be eligible to hold any other awards with a value of \$1,000 or more. To renew the scholarship, students must satisfy the passing grade requirements of their degree, maintain full-time status, and complete 30 credits (the normal academic workload) in a 12 month period to be eligible to renew the bursary. Application form is required. Applicants will be asked to upload two reference letters from the following: a teacher, counselor or professional. Their letter should speak of how you have struggled academically because of financial and personal challenges. Preference will be given to students pursuing applied studies.

Laurentian University 35th Anniversary President's Scholarship

Value: \$1,000/ea. Recipients: 1st-year students enrolled in any undergraduate program, on the basis of academic standing (min. 80%) in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).

Laurentian University Entrance Academic Excellence Awards

(For students who began their studies in 2017-2018 or prior)

Each newly admitted student who just graduated from full-time studies at a secondary school and meets the criteria to be an Ontario Scholar (on 6 best U/M courses) is guaranteed an entrance scholarship. The value of the scholarship is as follows:

80% - 84.9% up to \$4,500 (\$1,000 in 1st year, renewable in subsequent years provided average is maintained, increased to \$1,500 in 4th year) *

85% - 89.9% up to \$6,500 (\$1,500 in 1st year, renewable in subsequent years provided average is maintained, increased to \$2,000 in 4th year) *

90% - 94.9% up to \$10,500 (\$2,500 in 1st year, renewable in subsequent years provided average is maintained, increased to \$3,000 in 4th year) *

95% - 100% up to \$14,500 (\$3,500 in 1st year, renewable in subsequent years provided average is maintained, increased to \$4,000 in 4th year) *

Laurentian University Federation Memorial Award

Laurentian and its federated institutions created the Laurentian University Federation Memorial Award to recognize the sacrifices of our soldiers and their families, of those who give their lives doing what we as a nation have asked of them.

The award will provide full-time Laurentian students tuition for up to four years of study, and free on-campus housing in Sudbury for the first year.

To be eligible, a student must be under the age of 26, a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, dependent on a Canadian Forces member killed while deployed on combat or peace support operations, and registered as a full-time undergraduate at Laurentian University in Sudbury or one of its federated universities. Application required.

LAAA-Alumni Association Entrance Scholarship

Value: \$2,500. Recipient: a full-time student entering the 1st year of any program, with a min. 70% average in a secondary school. Student must not be in receipt of any other awards from the University.

LAAA-Alumni Association Faculty Entrance Scholarship

Value: \$500/ea. Recipient: one student in each of Sciences/Engineering, Arts (Humanities or Social Sciences), Professional Schools and Management. Based on academic standing (min. 80%) in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses) and financial need. A high school guidance counselor and Local 598 must provide a recommendation. Application required.

Pada Memorial Bursary

Established by the Pada family, friends and associates, in memory of a fine gentleman and noted CVRD-Inco geologist, Vishnu Pada. He and his two daughters, Brinda and Arti, died tragically in the crash of Air India flight 182 in 1985. The bursary will be awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need, and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP; the recipient must be a graduate student from Marymount Academy Secondary School. If no qualified applicant is chosen from Marymount Academy Secondary School, the bursary will be awarded to a full-time Geology Student at Laurentian University. Value: \$500. Applicants will be asked to provide the e-mail address of their high school guidance counselor, or teacher to provide reference. Application required.

R.J. Askin Memorial Scholarship

Donated by Abitibi-Price Inc. (Toronto), in memory of the late Robert J. Askin, a former Governor of the University and a member of the Board from its inception until his death in 1961. Mr. Askin demonstrated a keen interest in the affairs of the University and contributed greatly to engineering. Value: \$700. Recipient: a 1st-year student enrolled in any program, on the basis of academic excellence in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).

Sid Forster Memorial Award

Established by family and friends of the late Sidney Clair "Sid" Forster as a tribute to his dedication and commitment to his family and community. Value: variable. Recipient: a 1st-year student enrolled in any undergraduate program. The student must: (1) have demonstrated the greatest improvement in academic standing in secondary school studies; (2) have made a contribution to her or his school or community; (3) have demonstrated financial need; (4) be a resident of the City of Greater Sudbury. The applicant must provide the e-mail address of a teacher, or guidance counsellor to provide reference. Application required.

Faculty of Management

Faculty of Management Scholarship

The purpose of this award is to recognize a full time student in any program in the Faculty of Management at Laurentian University. Value is \$2,500 each.

Faculty of Science, Engineering and Architecture

Board of Governors Scholarship

Value: \$1,300. Recipient: a student entering the 1st year of a program in arts or science. The applicant must have obtained a min. 75% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses) or the equivalent and must not be in receipt of any other major award.

Build North Construction Inc. Architecture Scholarship Annual Award

Established by Build North Construction Inc. The purpose of this award is to provide financial assistance to a student of Laurentian University who is enrolled in the School of Architecture at Laurentian University. The recipient must be a student from Northern Ontario. The scholarship will be awarded at the discretion of the Director, School of Architecture. Value is \$5,000.

Douglas Williamson Bursary

Established to recognize the contributions of Dr. Douglas Williamson, a founder of the Department of Geology. Value: \$450. Recipient: a student entering the 1st year of the Geology program, on the basis of financial need and academic standing. Application required.

Engineering Entrance Scholarships

The purpose of this scholarship is to recognize full-time students entering their first year of the engineering program who have demonstrated high academic achievement. Preference will be given to students from Northern Ontario. The value of the scholarship ranges from \$500 to \$1000.

HARD-LINE Award in Mechatronics

Established in 1996, in Sudbury, Ontario, Hard-Line is a leading innovator and manufacturer of automation, teleoperation, and remote-control technology specialized in the mining industry. HARD-LINE has a proud track record of supporting the community in Northern Ontario. The company recently gifted the Bharti School of Engineering, \$250,000 to support continued excellence in their mechatronics program. The purpose of the HARD-LINE Award in Mechatronics is to provide financial assistance to one student entering the first year of study in Mechanical Engineering at the Bharti School of Engineering at Laurentian University. The successful recipient will demonstrate an interest in mechatronics or robotics (robotics competitions, self-directed projects at home etc.). One recipient will be chosen to receive the \$1,500 award. Preference will be given to applicants from Northern Ontario.

McEwen School of Architecture Portfolio Design Awards

To be awarded annually to incoming students to the Architecture Program. The Award is given based upon the creative aspect of their portfolio as well as the quality of the work that is displayed. For the Portfolio Design Awards, the McEwen School will give an amount to be determined per year plus a certificate with each student's name on it. The amount of recipients will vary per year, depending upon the overall quality of the portfolios that the faculty rate as 'excellent.' Selection of the recipients as well as the amount of each award will be made by the Director of the McEwen School of Architecture.

Northeastern Ontario Construction Association Architecture Scholarship

Northeastern Ontario Construction Association (NOCA) began in 1948 with a solid foundation – the skills and experience of local contractors and trades people. Today, the Northeastern Ontario Construction Association is an ICI association supporting contractors, manufacturers & suppliers, service providers, consulting firms, and training and personnel providers. The Northeastern Ontario Construction Association promotes member interests and provides specialized services to help more than 300 members compete and succeed.

As soon as the concept of bringing a School of Architecture to downtown Sudbury and Laurentian University was created, the Northeastern Ontario Construction Association was quick to lend its support. The NOCA was the first association to create a scholarship to help attract bright, young architects to Northern Ontario.

This scholarship is awarded annually to one full-time student, who is a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, entering the first year of the School of Architecture at Laurentian University. Preference will be given to a student who demonstrates academic merit. Value of the award is \$2,500. Selection of the award recipient shall be made by the Student Awards Office at Laurentian University. Application required.

Ontario Association of Architects Annual Scholarships

Established by The Ontario Association of Architects. The purpose of these awards is to recognize two full time students in the Architecture program at Laurentian University. Value is \$2000 each. The recipients' names will be published in the OAA's Annual Report. No application necessary.

The Scholarships will be awarded in the subsequent manner:

- 2014 scholarships will be awarded to two students with the highest grade average
- 2015 scholarships will be awarded to the top 1st year student and the top 2nd year student
- 2016 scholarships will be awarded to the top 2nd year student and the top 3rd year student
- 2017 scholarships will be awarded to the top 3rd year student and the top 4th year

Ontario Professional Engineers Foundation for Education Entrance Scholarships

The purpose of this award is to recognize two full-time well-rounded entrance students (one female/one male) enrolled in CEAB-Accredited programs within the Bharti School of Engineering who have demonstrated a combination of high academic achievement and exhibit characteristics of leadership. As a minimum requirement, recipients must have graduated with an Ontario Secondary School Graduation Diploma with an overall average of at least 80 percent in academic subjects. Value is \$1,500 each. Application is required.

School of Architecture Founders' Award

An award created by the faculty and staff at the School of Architecture to recognize creativity and holistic well-being in design or landscape design. The prize will be awarded to a student(s) whose work celebrates Northern Ontario. The recipient(s) must be enrolled in the Architecture program at Laurentian University. Selection will be made by the Director, Laurentian Architecture Laurentienne. Value is \$1500.

All Faculties

Association des Étudiantes et Étudiants francophones (1997) Bursary

Value: \$1,000/ea. Recipients: francophone students who are members of the AEF, on the basis of financial need and Ontario residency, as defined by OSAP. Application required.

CIBC Wood Gundy Children's Miracle Bursary

Value: \$1,000/ea. Recipients: full-time students entering any year of any program, on the basis of demonstrated financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP. Application required.

CTV Incorporated Bursary in Honour of Brenda Wallace

Value: \$1,400/ea. Recipients: students entering any year of any program, on the basis of financial need and Ontario residency, as defined by OSAP. Application required.

Élisabeth Bruyère Bursaries

These \$1,000 bursaries are awarded each year to 1st year students in need of financial assistance. Applicants must be graduates of an Ontario French-language catholic secondary school. Application required.

International Student Support Bursary

The purpose of this bursary is to provide financial support to one or more International students who have demonstrated financial need. This bursary will be granted on an annual basis to Laurentian University International students from any year of any undergraduate or graduate program. Award is not renewable. Value is variable.

Joubin/Selig Scholarship

Established by Joubin/Selig Family Fund.

This scholarship provides financial assistance to a Laurentian University student in any year of any program, with permanent physical (mobility) disabilities. The student recipient must demonstrate financial need, academic merit and be a resident of Ontario.

Value is \$10,000.

Laurentian University Entrance Bursary

Bursaries are non-repayable awards offered to students who demonstrate financial need. These awards are valued at \$600 to \$1,000 each. Eligibility is based on financial need. Laurentian University Entrance Bursary Application required.

Laurentian University Physical Plant Bursary

Donated by the staff and management of the Department of Physical Plant, Planning and Security. Value: \$500. Recipient: a full-time student entering any year of any program, on the basis of financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP. Application required.

Laurentian University Speakers Recognition Bursary

“Laurentian University Speaker Recognition Bursary”. Established by Laurentian University employees. This award was created to provide speaker recognition, in lieu of a speaker gift. The purpose of this award is to provide financial assistance to the student with the greatest financial need in any program at Laurentian University. Value is variable with a maximum of \$500 per award.

Matthew Ray Memorial Bursary

Established by Shane and Johanne Nagel. The purpose of this award is to recognize a full time student in any program at Laurentian University who is living in Residence or involved in Residence life. Preference will be given to a student with a documented learning disability. The recipients must be able to demonstrate financial need; Value is \$500. Application is required.

OSOTOF Direct mail bursary

Student must be registered full-time in a Laurentian University program of study, demonstrate financial need as defined by OSAP. Application for financial aid bursaries is required.

OSOTOF President's Bursary (Direct Mail)

Awarded to students entering any year of any program, on the basis of financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP. Application required.

Scotiabank Annual Award for students with disabilities

“Scotiabank Award” was established by Scotiabank to aid a student with a severe mobility or sensory impairment who is enrolled in any discipline at Laurentian University. The candidate must provide a letter with their application demonstrating a social commitment to the improvement of quality of life for people with disabilities. Recommendation from the Accessibility Services Office is required. Value of the award(s) is variable, up to a maximum of \$2,000. Bursary application is required and must demonstrate financial need.

Sylvie Landry French Language and Culture Award

The award is given annually to a full-time student who demonstrates efforts in promoting the French language and culture. Selection of the award recipient shall be made by the Student Awards Office at Laurentian University. Value is \$1,000.

Faculty of Arts

Darcy Noelle Kemp Memorial Award

Donated by the family and friends in memory of the late Darcy Noelle Kemp, a graduate of the University. Value: \$200. Recipient: a student entering the 4th year of a Bachelor of Arts in social sciences, on the basis of academic achievement (min. 70% average) and financial need. Application required.

Human Resources Scholarship

Established by Therese Klotz. The purpose of this award is to recognize a full time student seeking a career in Human Resources at Laurentian University and pursuing studies in related fields such as Business, Psychology or Social Work. The recipient must demonstrate high academic achievement. Preference will be given to a student working (e.g. part time or as a co-op or work placement) within the Human Resources and Organizational Development Department at Laurentian University. Value is \$1,200. Application is required.

Faculty of Education

Hillary Afelskie Memorial Bursary

The Hillary Afelskie Memorial Bursary has been developed to honour the memory of this young woman's dream, from a very young age, to teach. This bursary is funded by the Bachelor of Education Student Association (B.Ed.S.A.) and will be awarded to an undergraduate Concurrent Education student. The criteria for this award includes: examples of great promise for his/her future in teaching, strong dedication to academics, a willingness to help others, superior initiative within his/her participation in extracurricular activities and financial need. Applicants are required to submit a bursary application through the Student Awards office, as well as, submit a 500 word essay to the B.Ed.S.A. President on "how" they meet the criteria for this award. Hillary's caring spirit will live on as this award will help other aspiring teachers make a difference in the lives of others. Value of the award is \$500. Selection of the award recipient shall be made by the Student Awards Office at Laurentian University. Application required.

Sister Cécile Larocque Memorial Scholarship

Established by family and friends, this scholarship is awarded to a Francophone student completing the final year of study in French at *École des sciences de l'éducation* at Laurentian University. The student must have taken a religion teaching course and/or religion teaching methods course and be originally from Northern Ontario, with demonstrated involvement in their studies and the teaching profession. The recipient will be chosen in conjunction with *École des sciences de l'éducation*. Value is \$500. Application is required.

Faculty of Health

Arthur and Eva Solomon Bursary

In memory of Arthur and Eva Solomon who helped to create both the Native Studies and the Native Human Services programs at Laurentian University. Donated by the Solomon family and friends, three bursaries, each valued at \$400, will be awarded to full-time Native students who are enrolled in any year of the following programs: Native Studies, Native Human Services and any other program offered through Laurentian University. These bursaries are based on financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP. A bursary application is required.

In memory of Arthur and Eva Solomon who helped to create both the Native Studies and the Native Human Services programs at Laurentian University. Donated by the Solomon family and friends, a minimum of three bursaries will be awarded to full-time Indigenous students who are enrolled in any year of the following programs: Indigenous Social Work and any other program offered through Laurentian University. These bursaries are based on financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP. Application is required. Value is variable.

Human Resources Scholarship

Established by Therese Klotz. The purpose of this award is to recognize a full time student seeking a career in Human Resources at Laurentian University and pursuing studies in related fields such as Business, Psychology or Social Work. The recipient must demonstrate high academic achievement. Preference will be given to a student working (e.g. part time or as a co-op or work placement) within the Human Resources and Organizational Development Department at Laurentian University. Value is \$1,200. Application is required.

The Karen Metson Memorial Bursary

“Karen Metson Memorial Bursary”. Established by the Metson family, the award recognizes a fourth- year Laurentian University Nursing student who demonstrates financial need. Award is non-renewable as it is only available to fourth-year students. Value: \$1,000.

Lena Catherine Reid Award

Must be in the nursing program.

Marie Goring Bursary

Established to honour Mrs. Marie Goring by her family and friends. Mrs. Goring moved to the Sudbury area as a nurse and this award is intended to encourage young nurses to dedicate themselves to maintaining academic and clinical excellence in their chosen profession. The “Marie Goring Bursary” is awarded to two students in good academic

standing in any year of study in Nursing at Laurentian University, who have demonstrated excellence in clinical practice, can demonstrate financial need, and are residents of Northern Ontario. Minimum value \$1000 each. Application is required.

Marilyn Campbell Memorial Nursing Bursary

Established by her sons, David and Brian Campbell and her granddaughter, Samantha Campbell, in memory of their mother and grandmother, Marilyn. Marilyn was a nurse for 35 years initially at St. Joseph's and then Laurentian Hospital. She retired from nursing to care for her ailing husband, Desmond in 1990. Her caring and compassionate nature cultivated as a nurse extend to her husband, children, family, and friends. The purpose of this award is to recognize a full-time student enrolled in any year of the Nursing program at Laurentian University. The student must demonstrate financial need and be a Sudbury and area resident. Value is \$500. Application is required.

Eskoonwijig Mnaaj'aawag - Celebrating our Students Award

Established by School of Indigenous Relations to aid a full time student enrolled in the School of Native Human Services. The recipient must have completed all 2nd year requirements and have a minimum 76% cumulative average. The recipient must have an 80% class attendance rate. The recipient will have submitted a one page double space personal statement on, "Why I deserve this award". The qualified recipient will receive the award the first week of December. Applications will be available at the School of Native Human Services and must be submitted no later than October 15. Value is \$400.

Faculty of Management

Dr. Tuan Ton-That Memorial Bursary

Established to honour Tuan Ton-That by his family and friends.
