
The goal of the Speech and Language Clinic at Laurentian University is to educate and shape future professionals while offering assessment and intervention services to the Northern Ontario community.

Speech Language Pathology at Laurentian

Laurentian University offers a Bachelor of health sciences in speech-language pathology (*baccalauréat ès sciences de la santé en orthophonie*) and a Master of speech-language pathology on its Sudbury campus, in French.

The speech-language pathology programs at Laurentian University provide an interdisciplinary education in human communication sciences and disorders, thus helping students make connections between the human, social, natural, physical and cognitive sciences. Our students are zealous, engaged, and benefit from a bilingual learning environment throughout their studies. Our clinic offers quality rehabilitative services to people of all ages with communication disorders living in Northern Ontario, while also providing students with clinical activities that allow them to bridge the gap between the theory learned in their courses and practice.

Offering speech and language services in both French and English, our clinic allows students to apply their clinical skills in Canada's two official languages.



Our clinic

The clinic is located in Laurentian University's Parker Building, in the City of Greater Sudbury. Each therapy room is equipped with the materials required to conduct assessments and intervention.

The clinic offers services in fluency, voice, articulation, dysphagia, expressive and receptive language (both oral and written), as well as augmentative and alternative communication for children and adults.

Assessment and intervention services offered by the Speech and Language Clinic at Laurentian University are available to people of all ages in Northern Ontario.

Students taking part in these clinical activities are supervised at all times by registered Speech-Language Pathologists who are members in good standing of the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Ontario (CASLPO).
