

## DIRECTOR MSc PROGRAM - APPLIED MINERAL EXPLORATION

The *Harquail School of Earth Sciences* (HES) at Laurentian University invites applications for a **limited-term appointment** as **Director of the Applied MSc Program in Mineral Exploration,** starting on as soon as possible.

The Program Director will coordinate the School's efforts to expand the Applied MSc Program in Mineral Exploration. The goal is to ensure that our strong, well-established, and globally recognized program remains aligned with the geoscience and related skills needed to lead in the mineral exploration industry, solidifying its position as one of the premier applied programs worldwide. Responsibilities will include designing and implementing program growth strategies and courses, with support from the university administration, industry partners, and other academic institutions, to increase national and international enrollment. Program development will consider bridging gaps with other disciplines relevant to the entire mining cycle (e.g., engineering, business, environmental remediation). The successful candidate is also expected to deliver or coordinate graduate courses in the Applied MSc program.

## The successful candidate will have the following qualifications:

- An MSc or PhD degree in Earth Sciences or related field.
- Experience working in and interacting extensively with the mineral exploration industry.
- Experience working closely with academics. Teaching experience is an asset.
- Demonstrated communication, organizational, and project management skills.
- A commitment to promoting a diverse, inclusive and vibrant academic and work environment.

The Harquail School of Earth Sciences (<u>HES.laurentian.ca</u>) is home to the Mineral Exploration Research Center (<u>MERC.laurentian.ca</u>), the lead organization for the <u>Metal Earth Project</u>, the largest mineral exploration research project in Canada. Laurentian University, Canada's Mining University, is also home to the <u>Goodman School of Mines</u>, the <u>Bharti School of Engineering and Computer Science</u>, and the Mining Innovation, Rehabilitation, and Applied Research Corporation (<u>MIRARCO</u>).

A complete application includes the following:

- A cover letter (including a statement about citizenship/resident status as specified below).
- An up-to-date Curriculum Vitae.
- A statement with a vision of what the best comprehensive graduate program in mineral exploration should have and how to build it.
- A statement of teaching experience and teaching philosophy.
- The names and contact information for at least three references, preferably a combination of academic and industry.

Applicants should also arrange to have three letters of reference sent to the email address above. The deadline for receipt of applications is February 13, 2025, or until the position is filled.
