

POSTING FOR A TENURE-TRACK FACULTY POSITION IN ARCHITECTURE

The <u>McEwen School of Architecture</u> in the <u>Faculty of Science</u>, <u>Engineering and Architecture</u> at Laurentian University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates for a tenure-track faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor with a preferred start date of **July 1**, **2024***. Applicants must have demonstrable expertise in both of the following areas:

- 1) Sustainability and architectural design
- 2) Digital architectural representation, design process, technical detailing, and architectural practice

The successful candidate will have the following essential qualifications.

- A professional degree in architecture. Candidates who also hold a doctorate in architecture are preferred.
- Practicing architects should demonstrate that they are registered interns or licensed members of a professional association, along with a proven design record.
- The capacity to effectively teach at both undergraduate and graduate levels with a commitment to pedagogical and academic excellence promoting a safe, inclusive, and welcoming learning environment and advancing Laurentian University's bilingual and tricultural mandates.
- Evidence of very good research ability (scholarly publication record) and/or design ability (built work, competition & design awards) in addition to teaching competency.
- Fluently bilingual in written and spoken French and English
- Commitment to promoting a diverse, inclusive and vibrant academic and work environment.

In addition to active engagement and participation in teaching and research, the successful candidate will be expected to make contributions through service to the School, Faculty, University, and broader community. An on-campus presence is expected.

Established in 2013, the McEwen School of Architecture (MSoA) offers a four-year pre-professional Bachelor of Architectural Studies (BAS) degree, followed by a two-year professional Master of Architecture degree (MArch). Situated in northern Ontario, the MSoA focuses on design with wood, design-build, and community design projects. Our integrated co-operative program enables students to obtain practical experience through work-term placements in industry and in design or architecture offices. Francophone, First Nations, Métis, and Inuit student experience is central to the unique tri-cultural mandate of the program. The architecture program is delivered in English, with French language options for design studios, elective courses, and co-operative placements. Through Elders-in-residence, Indigenous faculty members, and French design studio instruction, students are exposed to a unique array of methods, knowledge and direct experience that informs community-design and design-build exercises.

The MSoA seeks innovative individuals with established records of design, practice, and a passion for teaching. Individuals should be ready to teach in the classroom, the design studio, and in the field with local community groups and partnerships. The successful candidate will teach in both the undergraduate and graduate architecture programs, conduct research in his/her/their area of architectural expertise through engaging in scholarly activities, and participate in the administration and governance of the University, and the MSoA including service

to MSoA committees and institution building. All faculty members are expected to teach architectural design in addition to developing expertise in a particular stream of the curriculum: Design, Culture, Technology, or Professional Practice. Laurentian is a bilingual university with a tricultural mandate, as such, fluency in French for this position is required.

Laurentian University, located on Atikameksheng Anishnawbek territory in Sudbury, Ontario, serves over 8000 students and is one of two bilingual universities in the province of Ontario. Committed to its bilingual, tricultural mandate, Laurentian University offers an outstanding university experience in English and French with a comprehensive approach to Indigenous education. Laurentian's beautiful, forested campus is surrounded by fresh-water lakes, conservation lands and hundreds of kilometres of cross-country and hiking trails while situated in the geographic centre of Greater Sudbury, northern Ontario's major urban centre (population 160,000). Laurentian University has close and productive ties to Science North, SNOLAB, Health Sciences North and multiple post-secondary institutions.

Application Requirements

A complete application includes the following:

- Cover letter (including one of the two statements about citizenship/resident status specified below)
- Complete, up-to-date curriculum vitae;
- Letter of intent, clearly indicating area(s) of expertise;
- A statement of current and prospective teaching experiences and interests;
- A statement of current and prospective research interests;
- Portfolio of design work in practice and teaching (if applicable);
- Names and full contact information for three referees (reference letters will be requested later in the process).

The application package, inclusive of all documents, should be submitted electronically as single PDF file (size max 50 MB) to: Office of Provost and Vice-President Academic at pvpa@laurentian.ca with the following subject line: application for faculty position in Architecture. The deadline for receipt of applications is **March 1**st, **2024** or until the position is filled.
