

POSTING FOR A TENURE-STREAM FACULTY POSITION IN ENGLISH LITERATURE, MEDIA AND WRITING

The <u>School of Liberal Arts</u> in the <u>Faculty of Arts</u> at Laurentian University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates for a full-time tenure-stream Assistant or Associate Professor position in the English Literature, Media, and Writing Program. The School is seeking applications from candidates with primary specialization in **Modern and/or Contemporary Literature** as well as secondary specialization in one or more of the following areas: **creative writing**; **film studies**; **drama/theatre studies**; **digital humanities**; **professional communication**. The preferred start date is July 1, 2025.

Candidates must have completed a PhD degree by the start date of the appointment. The successful candidate will have the following essential qualifications:

- A Ph.D. in English studies or a closely associated field
- The ability to teach and develop courses in their areas of primary and secondary specialization as well as first-year writing courses
- Active knowledge of both official languages (functional bilingualism) or receptive bilingualism (passive comprehension of the French language)
- Evidence of the ability to teach effectively at the undergraduate level with a commitment to pedagogical and academic excellence, promoting a safe, inclusive, and welcoming learning environment, and advancing Laurentian University's bilingual and tricultural mandates
- Evidence of strong research and scholarship which may include creative endeavours
- Commitment to promoting a diverse, inclusive, and vibrant academic and work environment.

The School particularly encourages applications from scholars whose interests and accomplishments are aligned with our <u>institutional strategic plan</u>. In addition to active engagement and participation in teaching and research, the successful candidate will be expected to contribute through service to the School, Faculty, University, and broader community.
